Dear Dr. Day:

The Republic of Panama informs the North Pacific Fisheries Commission (NPFC) of its decision not to apply for the renewal of the status of Cooperating Non-Contracting Party (NCPC) for the period 2024-2025.

This decision has been made considering that Panama has recently adopted a new regulation of its fisheries and aquaculture law, so it will be necessary for Panama to submit to a series of adjustments and changes, in order to ensure the correct implementation of the law.

For the time being, we appreciate all the support received from the Secretariat staff and the Members of the Commission; we have decided to cease operations in the North Pacific, however Panama is committed to submit all required data in accordance with the rules adopted for 2023 activities; to cooperate with the NPFC and other international partners in the fight to prevent, deter and eliminate IUU fishing activities; and to provide any other relevant information as determined by the NPFC, if required.

Additionally, until the conclusion of our current status as a Cooperating Non-Contracting Party, we will comply with the commitments made and Panama will attend the upcoming meetings and the next 7th Technical and Compliance Committee Meeting and the 8th Commission Meeting.
